Yom Kippur is considered the most important of Jewish holy days. It begins this evening at sundown. Though the Temple is long gone and the sacrifices cannot be legitimately offered, nonetheless, the day is still observed by orthodox Jews all over the world. Current

Jewish practice consists of the following: "By Yom Kippur the 40 days of repentance, that begin with the first of Elul, have passed. Since Yom Kippur is the day to ask forgiveness for promises broken to G-d, the day before is reserved for asking forgiveness for broken promises between people, as G-d cannot forgive broken promises between people. Yom Kippur is a day of 'NOT' doing. There is no blowing of the Shofar and Jews may not eat or drink, as fasting is the rule. It is believed that to fast on Yom Kippur is to emulate the angels in heaven, who do not eat, drink, or wash. The Five Prohibitions of Yom Kippur are eating and drinking, washing, anointing with perfumes or lotions, marital relations, and wearing leather shoes. While Yom Kippur is devoted to fasting, the day before is devoted to eating. According to the Talmud the person 'who eats on the ninth of Tishri (and fasts on the tenth), it is as if he had fasted both the ninth and tenth.' Prayer is also down played so that Jews can concentrate on eating and preparing for the fast." Jews gather at sundown at the synagogue. All are led in the "Kol Nidre", a renunciation of all personal vows, which is repeated three times. Most of the twenty-four hours are spent in prayer and the recital of psalms. Another important part is the confessions ("Vidui") on behalf of the community: "We are guilty..." The service closes with the "Neilah", one last opportunity to repent, and the repetition of "The Lord is our God" seven times. The Shofar (a trumpet of ram's horn) is blown and the people say, "Next year in Jerusalem", which ends the service. Reformed Jews also observe the day but do not fast and spend only the evening at the synagogue.
